

# Make A Democratic Values Notebook

The Democratic Values discussed in this module constitute the key concepts that elementary students in democracies like the United States and Germany are expected to have a working knowledge of. You can help your students preserve these materials for future review by binding their drawings into a book. If you do not have a publishing center, here's an idea for helping students bind their pages into a book.

Materials: cover stock (heavy paper), binding materials like metal prong fasteners, ribbons, or metal book rings

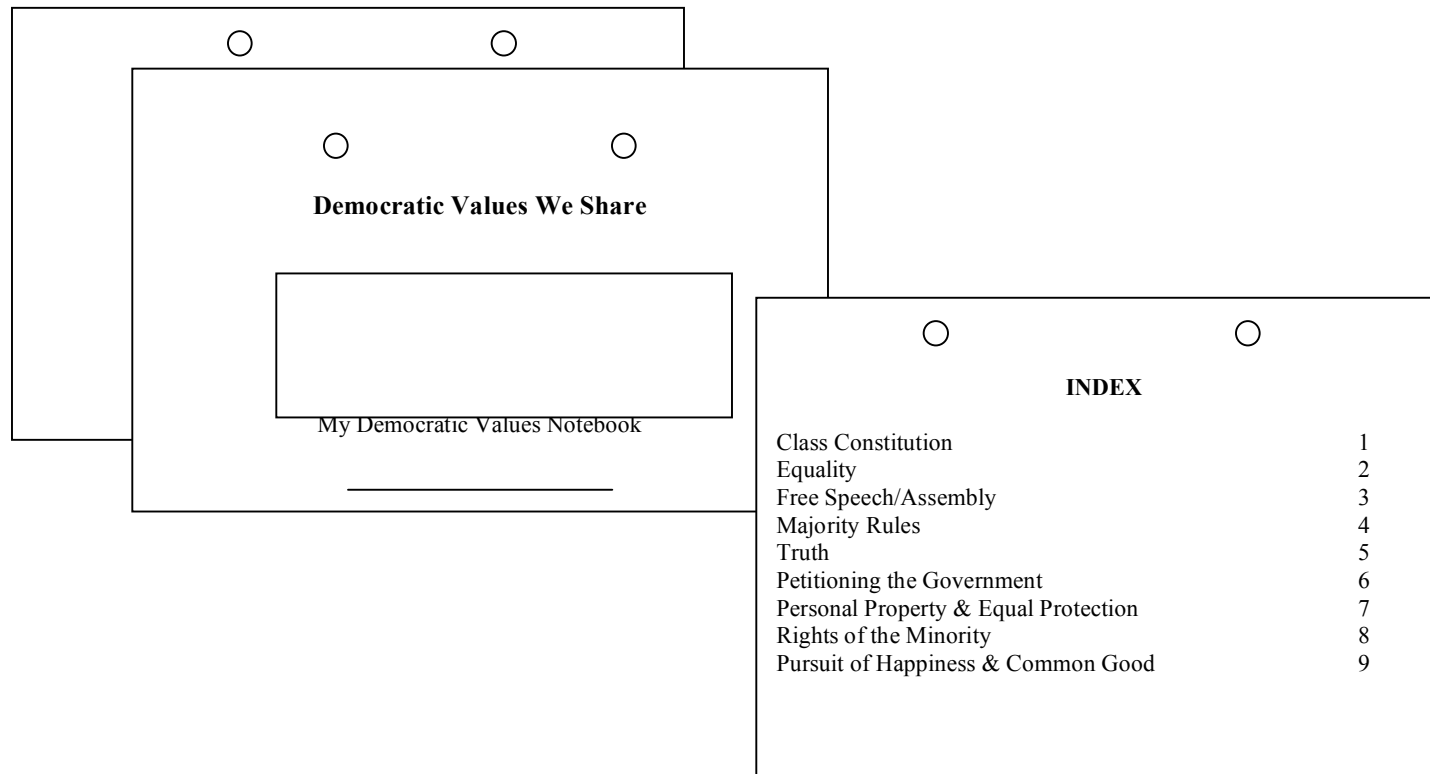
1. Use a stiff, cover stock paper for the front and back covers. Run the front covers through a copier using your own words or copy the sample provided on page 2 of this lesson plan.

2. Use a two hole punch to make holes in the front and back covers. Punch corresponding holes in each student's completed pages. (Kinko's will drill holes in large stacks of paper for a nominal fee.)

3. Create an Index and make one copy for each student, (or use the one found on page 3). Ask students to number each of their activity sheets according to the Index, and arrange the numbered in numerical order.

4. Pass out one cover page to each student, and ask them to write their name on the line. They may also draw a picture of the Democratic Value most important to them.

5. Pass out the back covers and the binding materials. Ask students to assemble their books.
